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Under the [Supplemental Charter](#), the University is empowered to confer and withdraw academic awards, to collaborate with other institutions and individuals to confer joint and other awards, and to affiliate or incorporate another institution.

[Council Ordinance 9](#) confirms that Senate is responsible for regulating, governing and quality assuring the University's academic provision, the authorising of degrees (other than honorary degrees), and establishing or terminating collaborative academic partnerships.

Procedures for the approval and management of collaborative academic partnerships are set out in a Code of Practice approved by Senate.

All awards made under a collaborative academic partnership must be of an equivalent academic standard to awards for programmes delivered by the University.

Senate will approve the mode and location of delivery of collaborative academic partnership programmes.

Students registered on a programme at Brunel University London may complete some of their studies at another institution within the UK or overseas. Senate approval is required for any such arrangements.

Where programmes of study result in an award from Brunel University London, the partner institution should comply with the Senate Regulations, unless Senate confirms otherwise.

Partner institutions should comply with Brunel University London's requirements for quality assurance and enhancement, and for student support and guidance, unless Senate confirms otherwise.
